The Pickwick Stables Horse Show is operated in accordance with the current rules of the Howard County Horse Show Association. By entering this competition, and signing the entry form, the exhibitor agrees to be subject to the Howard County Horse Shows Association Rules, the prize list and the local rules of the competition.

Hunter Derby - Will consist of two rounds. First round hunter round with a minimum of 10 obstacles set at heights determined by the horse show, Obstacles may simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and the course should offer a variety of jumps with different appearances. The second round (for the top 8 horses in the first round) will be a handy hunter round with a minimum of 8 obstacles set at height determined by the horse show. The course may simulate riding over hunt country.



**Timed first jump-off:** The first round and first jump-off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. If there are no clean rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults.

**Timed first round:** The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. Horses with clean rounds or equal faults are classified according to their time taken to complete the course.

**Power and Speed:** The first phase to consist of 8 to 10 jumping efforts and the second phase (immediate jump-off) of 5 to 7 jumping efforts. Scores are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed if any. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, he will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the designated jump-off course.

#### **Rules and Regulations**

1. Entry Fee \$20.00 per class. Except where noted.

## No Office, Grounds or EMT fee.

- 2. All ages as of Dec. 1 of the previous year.
- 3. Six ribbons will be awarded in all classes. Champion and reserve ribbons in all divisions.
- 4. The State of Maryland requires that all horses and ponies must be in possession of a current negative Coggins Certificate taken within 12 months.
- 5. USEF helmet rule will be enforced. Riders must also wear proper attire.
- 6. Cross entering permitted according to the HCHSA rules. Check your Rule Book for any rule changes.
- 7. The management reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes or divisions with insufficient entries.
- 8. To be eligible for championship points and year-end awards, in a hunter division, a horse or pony must enter and complete the course in at least one (1) over fences class.
- 9. All ponies must have a current measurement card or be measured prior to their classes.
- 10. Open schooling is permitted in the hunter rings from 7:00 until 8:15 am. PLEASE DO NOT raise, lower, or otherwise alter the jumps during schooling.
- 11. Food will be available for purchase.

Every entry shall constitute an agreement that the person making it, along with the leasee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, and the horse: (1) shall be subject to rules of the Association and the local rules of the show; (2) that every rider is eligible as entered; (3) that the owner and any of his representatives are bound by the rules of the HCHSA, MHSA and the show and will accept as final the decision of the Hearing committee on any question arising under said rules and agree to hold the show, the HCHSA, MHSA their officials, directors, employees, and agents harmless for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the show, whether or not such injury or loss

resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees, or agents of the HCHSA or Pickwick Stables Inc.

\*\*Leadline - Open to rider 7 years and under. Mounts not to exceed 14.2 hands. To be judged on suitability and control of mount. No martingales. Restriction: Not eligible for any other division at same show except Mini Stirrup.

Mini Stirrup - Open to riders 8 years and under. Mounts not to exceed 14.2 hands. To be judged on suitability and control of mount. No martingales. Restriction: Not eligible for any other division at same show except Leadline or Short Stirrup (rider must adhere to age restrictions in those divisions).

\*\*Short Stirrup - Open to riders 11 years and under. Mounts not to exceed 14.2 hands. Judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control. Fences not to exceed 18". Restriction: Riders not eligible for any other division at the same show except Children's Pleasure Horse and Pony, Low Pony or Mini Stirrup.

Long Stirrup - Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Open to horses and ponies. Judged on seat, hands, guidance and control. Fences not to exceed 2'. Restriction: Riders not eligible for any other division at the same show except Children's Pleasure Horse/Pony, Children's Hunter and Low Pony. Riders may not show in the Medal class.

\*\*Children's Pleasure - Open to horses and ponies of any breed suitable for English riding. Good manners are essential both in executing the gaits and while lined up in the ring. No martingales. Fences not to exceed 2'. Restriction: Horse and rider combination may not jump higher than 2'6" at the same horse show and may not show in the Ir. Medal class. \*\*Low Pony Hunter - Open to ponies. Judged on performance, manners, way of going,

and soundness. Fences not to exceed 2'.

\*\*Small/Medium Pony Hunter - Open to Jr. riders on ponies. Judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Fences not to exceed 2'.

\*\*Large Pony Hunter - Open to 13.2-14.2 ponies. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going, and soundness. Fences not to exceed 2'6".

Pre-Children's Hunter - Open to Jr. riders on horses only. Judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Fences 2'3". Restriction: The same horse and rider combination may not show in the Low Children's Hunter division at the same show.

\*\*Low Children's Hunter -Open to Jr. riders on horses only. Judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Fences 2'6".

\*\*Jr. Equitation - Open to horses and ponies ridden by a junior. May be split 13 and under 14-17. Judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of mount. Fences 2',2'6",3' rider's preference.

**\*\*Children's Hunter** - Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Open to horses only. on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Fences not to exceed 3'. Restriction: The same horse and rider combination may not show in the Pre or low Children's Hunter division at the same show.

HCHSA Junior Medal - Open to HCHSA Jr. members. Judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of mount throughout the course. The judge will then select at least one fourth of the class, but not less than six contestants, if available, to walk, trot and canter. One test of MHSA test 1-18 may be required. Three riders must complete the course.

\*\*HCHSA Children's Medal - Open to HCHSA Jr. members on horses. Judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of mount throughout the course. Fences 2'6. Restriction: Rider may not compete in classes were fences exceed 2'6"the same show.

HCHSA Pony Medal - Open to HCHSA Jr. members on ponies small/med 2'large 2'6". Jr. Achievement Award Benefit Hack - Open to all riders. Judged 50% on the horse and 50% on the rider. All entry fees are donated to the Scholarship fund.

**Jr. Achievement Award Benefit Hack** - Open to all riders. To be judged 50% on the horse and 50% on the rider. All entry fees are donated to the Scholarship fund. **Limited Adult Amateur Equitation-** Riders must be 18 years of age and over and eligible to hold an Amateur card as defined by USHJA. Adults may ride ponies. Riders are not to have won three blue ribbons in classes that requires them to jump greater than 2'3" in the past three years. Judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of mount. Fences not to exceed 2'. Restrictions: The rider is not eligible to compete in any other divisions at the show except Adult Pleasure Horse and Hopeful Hunter. Riders may not show in the Medal Class.

**Adult Pleasure-** Open to amateurs riding horses or ponies of any breed suitable for English riding. Good manners are essential both in executing the gaits and while lined up in the ring. No martingales. Fences not to exceed 2'. Restriction: Horse and rider combination may not jump higher than 2'6" at the same horse show and may not show in the Medal class.

**Hopeful Hunter-** Open to horses and ponies. Judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Fences not to exceed 2'-2'3". Adults may ride ponies.

**Pre Green Hunter-** Open to horses that have never shown over fences 2'6" or higher prior to December 1st of the previous year.

- \*\*Low Hunter Open to horses only. Judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Fences not to exceed 2'6 –2'9".
- \*\*Low Amateur Hunter Riders must be 18 years of age and over and eligible to hold an Amateur card as defined by USHJA. Judged on performance, manners, way of going and soundness. Fences 2'6". Restriction: The same horse and rider combination may not show in the Adult Amateur Hunter Division at the same show.
- \*\*Adult Amateur Equitation Riders must be 18 years of age and over and eligible to hold an Amateur card as defined by USHJA. Open to horses. Judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of mount. Fences 2'6" or 3', rider's preference.

**Schooling Hunter** - Open to horses only. Judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Fences not to exceed 2'9".

\*\*Thoroughbred Hunter-Open to horses registered with the Jockey Club Fences 2'6"

\*\*Adult Amateur Hunter - Riders must be 18 years of age and over and eligible to hold an Amateur card as defined by USHJA. Judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Fences 3'. Restriction: The same horse and rider combination may not show in the Low Amateur Hunter Division at the same show.

**Working Hunter** - Open to horses only. Judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness. Fences 3'.

HCHSA Adult Amateur Medal - Riders must be HCHSA members. Adults must ride horses. Judged on seat and hands, guidance and control of mount throughout the course.
